

Places of Interest in Bihar



Gaya - Bodhgaya

Bodhgaya, the place of enlightenment of Lord Buddha. Gaya, the holy city famous for Vishnupad Temple and Pitripaksha Mela



Sasaram

Famous for red stone tomb of Sher Shah Suri who built the Grand Trunk Road. Rohtas Garh, Kaimur Hills are the other star attraction here



Nalanda - Rajgir - Pawapuri

Rajgir, the ancient capital of Magadh Empire is a very good picnic spot. Pawapuri, the place of Mahanirvana of Lord Mahavira. Nalanda, ruins of 5th century BC University.



Kakolat Falls

A very beautiful picnic spot with a 160 ft. waterfall and a deep natural reservoir. The scene is panoramic due to all-round green forest area



Vaishali

Vaishali was one of the earliest republics in the world (6th century BC). It is also the Birthplace of Lord Mahavira. Here Buddha preached his last sermon.



Valmiki Nagar

Valmiki National Park at the foot of magnificent Himalayas is famous for its picturesque wild life sanctuary and Tiger Reserve.

Places of Interest in Patna



Golghar

An imposing beehive-shaped structure constructed by Captain John Garstin as a state Granary. From the top one can have a breathtaking view of river Ganges and Patna



Padri Ki Haweli, Patan Devi & Sheelta Mandir

Padri ki Haweli is the place where Mother Teresa got her training. Patan Devi and Sheelta Mandir are ancient places of worship for Hindus



Bihar Museum & Jalan Museum

Bihar Museum has a prized collection of archaeological finds from different part of the state. Jalan Museum has one of the biggest private collection of artifacts in India



Kumhrar

Site of ancient Mauryan capital Patliputra. Archaeological findings here establish Patna's claim to over a thousand years of political glory - 600 BC to 600 AD. Must watch is huge Mauryan hall supported by 80 sandstone pillars dating back to 300 BC.



Takht Shri Harmandir Sahib

The Birthplace of Sri Guru Govind Singh Ji, the tenth Sikh Guru is one of the five takhts of Sikhs. A number of scriptures and personal belongings of the Guru have been preserved here.



Sanjay Gandhi Jaivik Udyan (Zoo)

The zoological and botanical garden park spreads over a several acres of land with a variety of fauna and floral species. Popular wild animals here are tigers, lions, elephants, crocodiles, Giraffe, deers and antelopes.
